## EXTRA CREDIT

*You can mix and match the options below, but I will award only 20 points total.*

### How can I earn extra credit?

Step 1: I allow you to earn up to 20 points of extra credit.

Step 2: You pick from the options listed below.

**Special Note:** If I determine you have plagiarized or otherwise cheated in the course all extra credit is forfeited.

**Choices:** This first set of options does NOT require a Reaction Paper, but do follow the instructions outlined for each choice.

#### Service Learning (at your field site)

You can collect extra credit by spending more time at your field site. Document this by adding the hours to the bottom of your Log of Hours page. The Log of Hours form is all the documentation you need.

#### Community Service (Free)

You can't save each attempt, so print at end of each effort and collect.

The way you can document this is by printing the last page of the game. If it does not print well, you can use the <shift>+<Prnt Scrn> to copy the page and open a word document and use <ctrl>+v to paste the page. Then print.

- Go to <http://freerice.com> For each 500 grains of rice, you earn 1 point.
- Go to <http://www.freekibblekat.com/> For each 500 pieces of kibble, you earn 1 point.
- Go to <http://www.charitii.com/> For each 500 sq inches of rain forest (Nature Conservancy) and/or 500 minutes (OakTree) and/or 500 ounces of water (Charity: Water) you earn 1 point.
- If you find another "play to donate" site, let me know and I may approve it.

#### Games (Free)

- You are welcome to choose these games as a way to earn your extra credit.
- The way you can document this is by printing the last page of the game. If it does not print well, you can use the <shift>+<Prnt Scrn> to copy the page and open a word document and use <ctrl>+v to paste the page. Then print.

### How to write a Reaction Paper

- Reaction Papers must be typed.
- The content should start with a brief description of what occurred in the video or at the event; then, continue with what your own thoughts about this experience.
- There should be 25 words for each 15 minutes spent in the effort; perform a word count and type this at the bottom of the Reaction Paper.

### Watch a video and write a reaction paper (instructions below)

- You may watch a video for extra credit: Watch a video FROM THE LIBRARY (any video not shown in class and which has GN in its call number is fine; others may be appropriate, but check with the instructor first).
- You may use the Internet to access videos (as you all pay a computer lab fee you have access to computers on campus, even if you do not have a computer at home).
- Watch a video on PUBLIC ACCESS television (meaning you can get it without cable).
- Watch videos at home from this websites; these options require submission of a reaction paper (see syllabus).
