

EXTRA CREDIT

You can mix and match the options below, but I will award only 20 points total.

How can I earn extra credit?

Option 1: You may watch a video for extra credit: Watch a video FROM THE LIBRARY (any video not shown in class and which has GN in its call number is fine; others may be appropriate, but check with the instructor first).

- You may use the Internet to access videos (as you all pay a computer lab fee you have access to computers on campus, even if you do not have a computer at home).
- Watch a video on PUBLIC ACCESS television (meaning you can get it without cable).

Option 2: Attend either on-campus or off-campus event. Examples of these types of events include working at the annual Coastal Gathering, Students of Color Conference, The World Languages' Hispania Mania celebration, etc.

Option 3: Volunteer: I often announce volunteer opportunities in my classes. Sign up and the time you spend volunteering is double points (the maximum you can earn is still 20 points but you receive twice the points per hour and earn your points twice as fast).

How many extra credit points can I earn?

- You will receive extra credit point for each 15 minutes. If you volunteer it is 2 points for every 15 minutes.
- The maximum is 20 points of extra credit points, though no matter how many options in which you participate you only will receive 20 points.
- Remember, these points are not added to your in-class extra credit (those are separate points) or to your assignment-specific extra credit either (those are separate points, too).

How do you document that you did Extra Credit work?

First, write a Reaction Paper (not required if the points are earned as a volunteer!).

- Reaction Papers must be typed.
- The content should start with a brief description of what occurred in the video or at the event; then, continue with what your own thoughts about this experience.
- There should be 25 words for each 15 minutes spent in the effort; perform a word count and type this at the bottom of the Reaction Paper.

Second, you need to document the time spent doing the extra credit.

- If you watched a video in the library then type the citation for the video in APA format as at the top of the Reaction Paper and add the time length of the video.
- If you watched a Public Access television video, attach a copy of the T. V. listing.
- For cultural events, attach a copy of brochures flyers or other literature available only at the event and type the amount of time you spent at the top of the Reaction Paper. Talk to me if no literature was made available.
- For volunteer work, you do not need to document your time, unless I otherwise so indicate. [I get a list of participants from the event organizer or I provide a sheet for you that asks for the organizer's signature.]

Third, I ask you complete the Extra Credit Documentation page I passed out at the start of the quarter

- Be sure to register and tally all your points for me and then staple the Reaction Paper behind this page.
- Anthropology 206D only: If you earned the points at your field site, use the Log of Hours page instead of the Extra Credit Documentation page.
- I need to be very clear, the total number of extra credit points you can earn is 20 points, no matter how much work you do.

NOTE: In the event of my determination that a student is cheating, I will make that student ineligible for any extra credit points of any kind. This means any and all such points assigned during the course of the class. This is in addition to any other penalty implemented as outlined in the section on cheating. These points are not a guaranteed point option for the student, they are a privilege.
